Boarding Checklist

Here is a checklist of items that you may wish to bring when you board your dog(s). The items with an * are required.

- * Food - In an effort to provide the best care for your dog, we request that you bring your dog's food, along with written instructions for feeding. This helps prevent any upset stomachs or food allergies because of a sudden change in diet. Please do not bring more than one or two additional meals than your dog(s) will eat during their stay. If you do not bring your dog's food, we will feed our house adult dry dog food for an additional charge of \$1 per meal, or \$1 per cup, whatever is greater.
- * Vaccination Records - If you haven't already provided the vaccination records for your dog(s), bring a copy of your records when you check-in.
- * New Client Form - If your dog is staying at the Resort for the first time, you must complete the New Client Form. If you haven't already provided the completed form for your dog(s) by email or fax, be sure and bring it with you when you check-in.
- Medications - Bring any medications that your dog(s) is currently taking, along with the original bottle and labeling and written instructions for administering the medication.
- Toys - You may bring one or two of your dog's favorite toys. Toys are not allowed during playgroup, but they can be used in the private yards. If your dog likes to eat his toy(s), please don't bring them!
- Food bowl - Although we have plenty of food bowls for your dog's stay, some dogs don't adapt to change as quickly as others and may prefer to eat from their own bowl. You may bring your dog's bowl if you feel he/she falls into this category.
- Comforter or bedding - Each of the dog cottages has a raised bed, but if your dog has a comforter or other bedding material that he normally sleeps on, you may bring it if you like. If your dog has something in the cottage that smells like home it sometimes helps them feel comfortable in a new environment.
